The aim is to encourage children to be friendly, to help overcome stereotypes and prejudices about the social environment of others, to promote respect for other nations, cultures and their traditions, to tolerate differences.

The children talked about their families, family members, their hobbies, travels, responsibilities, traditions, family celebrations.

The children drew themselves, their appearance and told how they look, what they like, what they like.
